

KIDS ARE HAPPY AND HEALTHY THANKS TO YOU



For many low-income families, the free and reduced-price school meal program alleviates the stress of buying groceries and packing lunches. But when school is out for the day, many of these children won't get to eat again until breakfast at school the next morning.

The Kids Cafe at Evangelist Baptist Church in Oklahoma City exists to make sure more children are going to bed with full stomachs. Through your gifts to the Regional Food Bank, this program provides a meal three days a week and a snack the other two days to nearly 70 children in 1st – 5th grades.



Kids Cafe Director Wanda Black says the children are much happier and more energized after eating the nutritious meals.

“They're so excited about the food when they come in!” she says.

Wanda says that for many of these children, the meal they receive from the Kids Cafe is the last meal they'll eat that day.

“Without this program, some of our children would more than likely not have a meal on the days we're not in session,” Wanda says, fighting back tears.

In fact, three siblings in the program have told Wanda they only get to eat on the days they come to the Kids Cafe. They're being raised by only one parent who isn't able to provide enough food for them. The family is so grateful for the filling snacks and meals they receive each week.

Because of friends like you, these children don't have to wait until breakfast the next morning for a full meal. Your gifts to the Food Bank enable programs like the Kids Cafe to serve nutritious food to hungry kids when they need it most. The children and those who serve them are so grateful for the help you provide.

“We appreciate you so very much!” Wanda says. “We feel very blessed to be able to provide a service like this. It's like a miracle for our children.”

But for students from low-income families who can't afford to provide the nutritious food they need on a daily basis, the odds are already stacked against them. It's nearly impossible for children to concentrate in class when their stomachs are growling.

But thanks to friends like you, there are far fewer children with growling stomachs in the classroom. Your generosity during our Matching Challenge provided much-needed resources for the summer, when financial donations typically drop. Because of your faithful support of the Regional Food Bank of Oklahoma, children had enough to eat throughout the summer and are ready to succeed in a new school year. Kids are Ready to Learn Because of You!

When a child is hungry, it's almost impossible for her to concentrate on anything but her empty stomach, much less her teacher's lessons.

At Telstar Elementary in Oklahoma City, staff member Candi Ahrens found many students were having a hard time paying attention in her computer class because they were so hungry. So three years ago, the school implemented the Regional Food Bank's *Food 4 Kids* program to combat the problem of childhood hunger.

Food 4 Kids, a program which your gifts make possible, provides backpacks of healthy, kid-friendly food to chronically hungry elementary school children every weekend throughout the school year. Candi, the *Food 4 Kids* Coordinator at Telstar, says last year they served 115 children, all of whom were on the free and reduced-price school meal program and come from low-income families. Without school meals on the weekends, many of these children were coming to school on Monday mornings without having had a full meal since lunch on Friday.

"These little backpacks have a dramatic impact on the kids," she says. "If they're hungry in class, they can't concentrate."

Ten-year-old Rykeem and 6-year-old Lesley have been taking home backpacks through *Food 4 Kids* for two years. Their mother, Lucritia, says the food they receive has made a huge difference for their family.

"It helps a lot!" she says. "There's a lot of good food in the backpack – it's not junk food. A lot of it is stuff we can't afford to buy."

Lucritia adds that both Rykeem and Lesley have been able to concentrate better in class now that they have nutritious food to eat on the weekends.

"They look forward to it every week!" she says.

Candi says dozens of other families have been impacted by the *Food 4 Kids* program as well. Mrs. Faulkner, a Pre-K teacher at Telstar, says she often gets thank you notes from parents of students on the program.

You make it possible for *Food 4 Kids* to feed thousands of children just like Rykeem and Lesley across central and western Oklahoma. Because of you, these children will be able to start each school week ready to focus on their futures rather than their empty stomachs.

When Kimberly's husband was seriously injured in an accident last year, she knew life would be difficult for them and their four children while he was out of work during his recovery. But she never imagined the family would be forced to split up after losing their home.

With only food stamps and her oldest son's disability check for income, Kimberly was unable to pay the family's mounting bills, leaving them to move in with various friends.

The family has since been reunited, but making ends meet is still a challenge. Kimberly says food stamps rarely stretch until the end of the month because meat, milk and baby formula are so expensive. Keeping enough food in the house for a large family has been hard, especially during the summer when the children are out of school.

But Kimberly knows she can get help from The Lord's Harvest Food Pantry when she needs food. This partner agency of the Regional Food Bank offers a special distribution at Burton Park in El Reno every Wednesday evening for families in need – and your gifts make this possible. Kimberly comes every week for nutritious groceries to feed her family.

"It's definitely a blessing," she says. "I don't know what I'd do without it!"

Kimberly's husband recently returned to his job, and she says their financial situation is looking better now that he's able to work again.

"It's definitely looking up," she says. "I can't wait to get ahead of the bills!"

A Man with a Mission

In 1975, 21-year-old Eugene left his home in Melbourne, Florida to try to start a new life in Houston, Texas. He hadn't been able to find a job in Florida and wanted to get away from his troubled past clouded with substance abuse and a difficult home life.

But his arrival in Houston brought a familiar rush of overwhelming panic.

"I looked up at all the buildings and thought, 'what am I gonna do now?'" he recalls. "I had no family and no friends. I had nobody to turn to at all."

Having spent all his money on the trip, Eugene desperately looked for a way to survive in a new city. Finding a job wasn't as easy as he thought it would be and he had nowhere to live. Eugene was suddenly homeless. He found a local Salvation Army, where he stayed for three months while working different manual labor jobs each day.

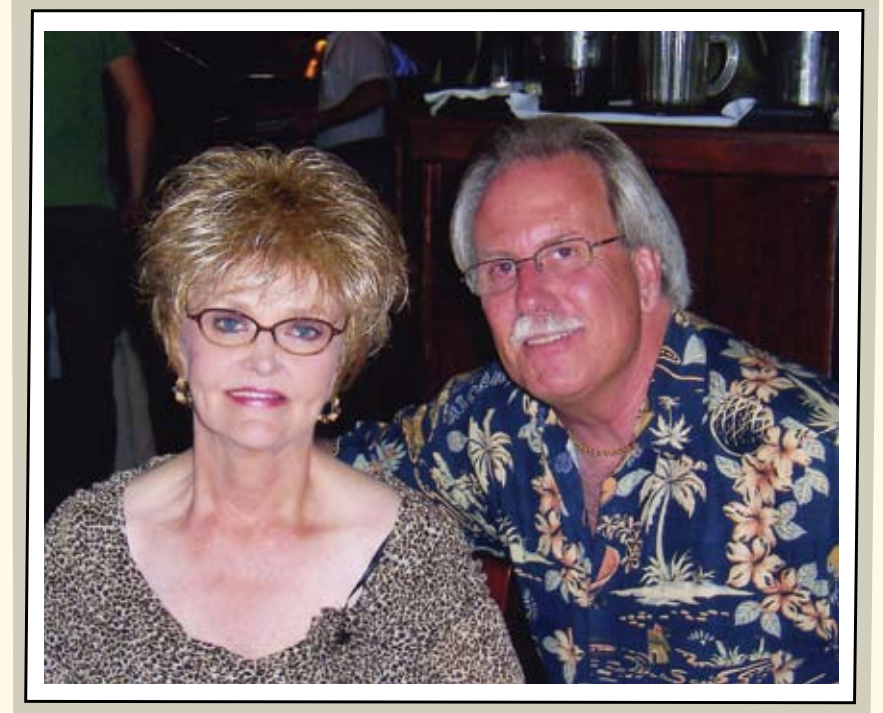
"I would get up at 4:30 every morning and work for \$2 an hour, working eight and nine hour days," he says. But at the end of the day, there was always something hot to eat at the Salvation Army.

Eugene was finally offered a steady job three months later. Since then, he has maintained full-time employment for more than three decades and even earned a college degree. He now lives in Moore, Oklahoma with his wife and makes a good living as a truck driver.

Now that Eugene has turned his life around, he is passionate about giving back to the community that helped him when he was in need. He is an incredibly faithful Food Bank donor who has made it his mission to give nearly every week.

"I look at what I ate for three months of my life, and if I can give a child a meal, it's such a small price to give back," he says through tears. "This is my way of saying 'thank you.'"

Eugene also encourages others to give back.

"Think about the money you spend for one meal, even if it's just \$10" he says. "If you took that \$10 and gave it to the Regional Food Bank, you could help 70 people have a meal tonight instead of buying a hamburger."

There's no sufficient way to express the gratitude we have for Eugene's generosity and for all of the gracious friends who make our work possible every day.

New IRA Rules Make Giving Easier

The Pension Protection Act of 2006 allows transfers from your IRA to go directly to a qualified charity. The provision provides for a reduction in gross income for certain distributions of up to \$100,000 from your IRA or Roth IRA account, which would otherwise be included as part of your income.

Requirements:

- + Donor must be at least 70 ½ years old
- + Distributions may not exceed \$100,000 per year
- + Gifts must be transferred directly to charity
- + No donor advised funds
