Devon Energy Employees Feed Hungry Mulhall and Orlando Families

(Mulhall, Okla.) – Dec. 15, 2014 – Yesterday, Devon Energy Corporation employees once again helped fight hunger in Mulhall and Orlando. Devon Energy volunteers distributed 120 Holiday Care and Share boxes of food, hams, bread and fresh produce to help feed Mulhall and Orlando families who are struggling with hunger.

“Devon values being a good neighbor,” said Matt Pettyjohn, production superintendent with Devon Energy. “Our employees jumped at the opportunity to get involved and make a difference. It is a very rewarding experience to partner with the Regional Food Bank and provide food for those in need this holiday season.”

Devon Energy provided the product for the food boxes and the volunteers to distribute them. This distribution couldn't have come at a better time, as many families in Mulhall and Orlando are having a difficult time making ends meet and often find themselves without enough food.

The Regional Food Bank provides enough food to feed more than 110,000 people each week in 53 central and western Oklahoma counties. Last year, the Regional Food Bank distributed more than 1,274,926 pounds of food to the hungry in Logan County. The Regional Food Bank serves six partner agencies in Logan County: Crescent Assembly of God, God's Food Bank, Inc., Hands of Jesus in Guthrie, Langston University College Food Pantry, Logan Community Services and New Horizons Group Home.

“Many of our neighbors are struggling with hunger this holiday season,” said Rodney Bivens, executive director of the Regional Food Bank of Oklahoma. “We want to thank Devon Energy and its employees for fighting hunger in Mulhall and Orlando. Thank you for your generosity in this season of sharing.”

One in six Oklahomans struggles with hunger every day. The majority of those served by the Regional Food Bank of Oklahoma are children, seniors living on fixed incomes and working families. Last fiscal year, the nonprofit distributed 47.8 million pounds of food and products through a network of more than 1,200 charitable feeding programs and schools in 53 central and western Oklahoma counties
