#### *EnLink Midstream Employees Feed Hungry Families in Stuart and Calvin*

**(Stuart, Okla.) – Dec. 8, 2014** – On Saturday, EnLink Midstream employees helped fight hunger in Stuart and Calvin. EnLink volunteers distributed 275 Holiday Care and Share boxes of food, hams, bread and fresh produce to help feed families who are struggling with hunger in Hughes County. This distribution was also in partnership with Stuart Church of Christ-Loaves and Fishes and Mercy Ministries-Loaves and Fishes, partner agencies of the Regional Food Bank.

“My EnLink colleagues and I are excited to come together to lend a helping hand and give back to our community” said Luke Kuhlman, Midstream Operations Foreman at EnLink Midstream’s Northridge Plant. “We’re proud to support the Regional Food Bank of Oklahoma and the admirable work they do to fight hunger.”

EnLink Midstream provided the product for the food boxes and the volunteers to distribute them. This distribution couldn’t have come at a better time, as many families in Stuart and Calvin are having a difficult time making ends meet and often find themselves without enough food.

The Regional Food Bank provides enough food to feed more than 110,000 people each week in 53 central and western Oklahoma counties. Last year, the Regional Food Bank distributed more than 655,751 pounds of food to the hungry in Hughes County. The Regional Food Bank serves three partner agencies in Hughes County: Holdenville Housing Authority, Loaves & Fishes in Holdenville and Loaves & Fishes in Calvin. There are also more than 150 students participating in the Food for Kids Backpack Program in Hughes County.

“Many of our neighbors are struggling with hunger this holiday season,” said Rodney Bivens, executive director of the Regional Food Bank of Oklahoma. “Thanks to EnLink Midstream and its employees, many families will now enjoy a nutritious holiday meal. We appreciate EnLink’s generosity and compassion during this season of sharing.”

One in six Oklahomans struggles with hunger every day. The majority of those served by the Regional Food Bank of Oklahoma are children, seniors living on fixed incomes and working families. The Regional Food Bank is the largest private hunger-relief organization in the state of Oklahoma. Last fiscal year, the nonprofit distributed 47.8 million pounds of food and products through a network of more than 1,200 charitable feeding programs and schools in 53 central and western Oklahoma counties.
